

John APPLEBY

James APPLEBY petitioned for land with his sons, Benjamin, John, Lucas and Henry in New Brunswick in July 1785 having been living on Washadamoac Lake.

Four of his sons served with each other in the 3rd and 4th Battalions of the New Jersey Volunteers. Only one son, Peter, died in service. The rest settled in New Brunswick.

John, a son of James, served first as one of Delancey's "Cowboys" then with his brothers in the New Jersey Volunteers. In 1783 he arrived on board the ship "Esther" at the River Saint John in New Brunswick eventually settling at Chocolate Cove, Deer Island, Charlotte County, NB.
