

Archibald HENEY

Originally from Ireland, Archibald Heney was a soldier at Fort Pownall in 1759 in the French Indian War and afterwards settling in Maine.

In 1779, Archibald helped build Fort George in Maine for the British. He was taken prisoner for adhering to the British cause, put in irons aboard the Brig "Hazard" was severely treated and threatened to be hanged as soon as the rebels had taken Fort George (Maine). He escaped when the ship was scuttled. He fled to Deer Island in New Brunswick.
