

John LAWLESS

In 1759 John Lawless was a Sergeant with James Wolfe on the Plains of Abraham. After returning to England, he decided to partake of the fruit of that victory and return to New England with his family as settlers. In 1770, he indentured himself as Capt Plato Owen's barber and signed up his wife and daughter to cook and wash aboard the ship "Snow Owen".

In 1771, he is listed with 7 New England families settled on Campobello Island. In 1784, the territory dispute between Britain and the United States resulted in their eviction as "persons loyal to Britain". He settled in Chocolate Cove on Deer Island, Charlotte County, New Brunswick. His daughter, Mary, married Andrew LLOYD in 1771.
